

**Guide for Reporting Academic or Non-Academic Misconduct**

Category:	Includes:	Reporting and Documentation:
<b>Academic Misconduct</b>	Academic dishonesty: Acts of cheating, fabrication or plagiarism	Allegations of academic misconduct will be reported in a signed statement to the <b>Vice President of Academic Affairs</b> who will review them.
<b>Non-Academic Misconduct</b>	Acts which threaten the safety, rights or well-being of the College community  Acts of violation of local, state or federal law	Allegations of non-academic misconduct will be reported in a signed statement to the <b>Vice President of Student Affairs</b> who will investigate them.
<b>Title IX - Sex Discrimination, Harassment, and Assault</b>	Sexually related misconduct, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking	Allegations involving sexual discrimination, sexual harassment or sexual violence will be reported in a signed statement to the following staff:  <u>Student, Faculty, &amp; Staff Resource:</u> <b>Vice President of Student Affairs &amp; Title IX Coordinator</b>
<b>Grievance</b>	Definition: An assertion or claim that a College practice or procedure is not in compliance with avowed institutional policy or with relevant federal or state legislation.	A grievance will be reported in a signed statement to the <b>Vice President of Student Affairs</b> who will investigate any complaint alleging non-compliance.
